how to use this planner:

- 1. Your student should meet with their counselor at least once a year to discuss their plans. Every school offers different classes and has different requirements. It's important that they ask a counselor to look over their plan and help them choose the right classes.
- 2. Use this as a living document. Refer back to it frequently (when it's time for your student to register for new classes, update grades, achievements, etc.). Have them check off courses as completed to know what requirements still need to be met and make sure they stay on track.
- 3. Help your student keep in mind the benefits to taking challenging classes: 1) it prepares them for the ACT, 2) Advanced Placement and dual credit classes allow students to earn college credit while still in high school which saves time AND money. and 3) it makes them more competitive for college scholarships.
- Even if your student thinks that college is not part of 4. their plan, it is a good idea to plan their high school classes with college in mind. Plans and thoughts change often during the high school years. Taking the right classes meant that if you child later decides to pursue college, he or she will be prepared.



Kentucky schools use 16 "career clusters" to help organize elective classes into groups based on career fields. Kentucky Career Clusters

Career Clusters provide a way for schools to organize classes and student experiences into 16 broad categories.
